Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The structure is a library in the Classical Revival having half columns emerging from the walls on both sides as well as full columns across the inset loggia of its facade. The overall style is severe having few details and no pediment. The library is situated on city park land overlooking a major lake which serves as a state boundary line between Texas and Louisiana.

The overall shape of the library is slightly more rectangular than square with the longest measurement being from the front of the building to the back. The forward half of the structure is two storied while the rear portion has only one story and is slightly wider. The construction is of reinforced concrete with the exterior walls of Bedford, Indiana limestone backed with brick and hollow tiles. Six columns of limestone dominate the facade, while half-columns emerging from the walls give the same effect to both sides of the forward (original) portion of the building. The flat roof is 5 ply Texaco roofing felt laid over a foundation of concrete with a Ludowici finish of 6 inch by 8 inch quarry tiles.

The entrance to the library is approached by limestone steps that run the entire 90 foot width of the structure. The entablature is supported by six smooth limestone columns 23 feet in height and being 2 feet and 3 inches in thickness at the base. The columns' entasis is slight with capitals of the Corinthian order. The detailing of the entablature is simple. The plain frieze bears the name of the library and the dedicatory legend with a decorative tondo medallion sculpted in bas-relief at either end of the frieze on the front and two sides of the two-story portion of the building. A row of dentils is just below the cornice which consists of molding with simple, clean lines.


The portico, or stoa, is 13 feet 4 inches by 58 feet $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Its ceiling height is 29 feet. The single front door is centered in the stoa and flanked on each side by two tall windows with small sectioned panes. The exterior framing on the door echoes the clean detailing of the building's exterior entablature. The three windows of the same style and size as those in the stoa are centered between the four half-columns on both sides of the structure.

The interior is plastered imitation limestone to match the exterior. The rooms have richly ornamented friezes and cornices with the ceiling finished to correspond to the overall style. Much of the wall space is taken by the tall windows which have detailed framing consistent with the exterior and interior Greek styling. They measure 7 feet and 8 inches by 15 feet 4 inches and have small panes in the Dutch style.

The original structure was built in 1917. In 1904 a renovation program included exterior sandblasting, new shades and floors. In 1952 the building was expanded by constructing a one-story addition attached to the sides (near the rear) and behind the original structure.

No changes were made in the existing building and the addition was compatible with the Classical Revival styling. The expansion program provided additional space for reading rooms, work areas, and lecture and committee rooms.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Gates Memorial Library is notable as a faithful exposition of the Classical Revival style and stands alone as such in the Port Arthur area. Its large scale is reflective of its history. The library was a gift to the city of Port Arthur by Mrs. Dellora R. Gates in 1918 in honor of her husband John W. Gates, philanthropist and industrial magnate of national prominence. As a farsighted city father and benefactor, John Gates also built a Methodist church and founded and built the Port Arthur Business College.

The Gates Memorial Library is one of three building complexes built by the John W. Gates estate on city park land granted to Gates by the city of Port Arthur in the early years of the twentieth century. Having accumulated a personal fortune in wire and steel manufacturing and oil investments (he was part owner of the famous Spindletop oil well near Port Arthur which ushered in Texas' first great oil boom in 1902), Gates became the city's foremost philanthropist, founding and building the Port Arthur Business College and a Methodist church across the street from and on the same park land as the library.

The library was actually built by Gates' wife, Mrs. Dellora R. Gates, after her husband's death in 1911. In 1916 Mrs. Gates carried out her husband's dream for the library by pledging \$30,000 for the building and \$25,000 for books. After the Smithsonian Institute researched Port Arthur's geographical area and produced a lengthy study regarding the climate and other physical factors which would aid architects in building a lasting structure, the architectural firm of Warren and Wetmore of New York was chosed to design the library. (The firm had also designed Grand Central Station and the Biltmore and Ritz hotels.) Taking into consideration the findings of the Smithsonian study, the architects designed a building that called for massive quantities of Indiana limestone which enhanced the structure's impressive proportions and careful detailing and made it an excellent example of the Classical Revival style. George A. Fuller Contracting Company of Houston became the builder.

Construction was begun in 1916 and completed in May, 1917 at an approximate cost of \$75,000. The library and land were given to the city in 1918. The library remained city property until August 1980 when its title was transferred to Lamar University (formerly Port Arthur Business College). The university will continue to use it as a library with the Port Arthur Public Library maintaining a branch. The gallery in the library will continue to serve as the Heritage Room of the Port Arthur Historical Society and will be the permanent home of the Society's museum which will maintain items of historical interest from every decade of Port Arthur history.





